☛ To be accepted, entries MUST be complete, signed (for minors, signed by parent or legal guardian), received by the closing date, and accompanied by the correct fees. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. Refundable cancellations or changes can not be made after the closing date. A competitor may advance the level of entry in writing via email until Monday, July 6th. No other changes will be accepted after the closing date of June 18th. There will be a \$35.00 service charge for returned checks. Amounts shall be paid within 30 days of postmarked notice of returned check if such date follows the event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse.

ALL competitors must check in their first day of competition. ALL DOGS MUST be measured prior to being checked in or competing in their first class UNLESS the handler presents a permanent card, check-in letter issued by USDAA or subscriber printout indicating the dog is permanently carded or a completed temporary card waiting for a CMJ. Dogs required to jump a higher height by virtue of measurement at this event will be placed first in the running order. Should the dog be unprepared for the higher height, it may run For Exhibition Only at the lower height, but no awards or qualifying scores may be earned and no change in program is permitted at check in.

The handler of a dog that measures up and is entered in Team or PVP MUST notify the secretary at check-in. If the jump height change impacts the team, the secretary shall make every effort to form complete teams from the dogs available. The dog measured up MUST jump at the higher height for the team/pair to earn a qualifying score. If the dog runs FEO at the lower height, the team/pair may NOT qualify, but the partner(s) may earn placements, top ten points and Lifetime Achievement Qs in the individual classes.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

🐾 Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations as amended March 30, 2007, including, but not limited to, the following rules regarding entry:

🐾 This test is open to all dogs over eighteen months of age, including purebred and mixed breeds, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dogs' physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.

🐾 All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in this event. A Registration form is included and registration may be made concurrently with entry. To receive a registration number immediately and a height card prior to the show, go online to www.usdaa.com, General Information, Dog Registration.

🐾 No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.

🐾 Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.

🐾 Dogs must remain on leash at all times, except when competing in the ring.

In Addition:

🐾 THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler is absent, disqualified, excused by veterinarian or judges, or barred from competition by action of the Event Committee. In addition, no entry fees will be refunded if the test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the club

🐾 Competitors (handler or their dog) may not enter any class held for title under a judge who resides in the same household or with whom they have trained in the past ten (10) days.

🐾 No entries may be accepted, changed, altered or withdrawn after the closing date except as outlined under "Entries & closing".

🐾 In the event of a large entry it may be necessary to impose fault or time limits in some classes at the discretion of the organizing committee.

🐾 This event will be held outdoors on grass at Middlesex 4-H Fairgrounds

🐾 There will be no equipment familiarization.

🐾 The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and it's Organizing Committee.

🐾 Confirmation letters will be sent out electronically via email unless you have specifically requested otherwise. Order of classes will be listed in the confirmation letters

🐾 **PRIZES AND AWARDS:** Test Classes: Each dog earning a qualifying score will receive a maroon qualifying ribbon. Separate 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place Rosettes will be awarded in each jump height for all classes, except Pairs which will be awarded to mini and open divisions. Title ribbons will also be awarded for completion of AD, PDI, AAD, PDII, MAD, PDIII, ADCH, APD.

4-STAR IFCS 2010 TEAM SELECTION EVENTS

Points may only be earned at events designated as 4-Star IFCS 2010 Team Selection Events which are comprised of the 2009 Regional Championships, local events so designated (may be a 2010 USDAA tournament qualifier) and USDAA Cynosport® World Games. Consideration for a position on the U.S. team is offered first to the handler/dog with the highest number of Team Selection (TS) points earned from the first four events attended plus the *Cynosport* World Games.

Points are awarded equally at each event by jump height based upon placements in the Grand Prix, Steeplechase and team individual classes of Gamblers, Jumpers, Snooker and Standard. Complete rules for selection and details of how points are awarded can be found at www.usdaa.com.

Team members are selected by the USDAA Regulations & Competition Standards (RCS) Board to represent the United States in the International Federation of Cynological Sports (IFCS) World Agility Championships to be held in 2010. Four teams of 3 dogs are chosen to compete in the four IFCS height divisions.

Class Descriptions

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – **Championship & Performance**. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test. Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels. Generally, Performance Level I, Level II, and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5’6”, jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard and jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program.

Standard, Gamblers, Jumpers, Pairs Relay, and Snooker

A complete description of these classes and the requirements for eligibility for entry may be found in Chapters 3-7 of Official USDAA Rules & Regulations, which are incorporated in this test schedule by reference. A summary of eligibility requirements for all titling classes is presented in Appendix E of the Rules & Regulations.

Performance Pairs is required for titling in all levels beginning 1/1/09. Partners for both Championship and Performance Pairs must be from the same level and height division, mini (Ch 12/16, Perf 8/12) or open (Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, dogs not entered in relay or dogs from another program/level may not be recruited to form a qualifying pair.

The following Tournament classes are being offered at this event: (all competitors are eligible for entry to any of these tournament classes.) A copy of the tournament regulations for each tournament may be found on the USDAA website at www.usdaa.com.

Dog Agility Masters® Team & Performance Versatility PairsSM

These tournament are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level and consist of 5 classes, standard, gamblers, jumpers, snooker and relay. Dogs on a team/pair compete individually with their scores accumulating toward the total team/pair score. Qualifiers will be determined after all five classes. Dogs earn Tournament Top Ten Points and Lifetime Achievement Qs in the individual classes (except relay). One qualifying score in the tournament overall is required for entry in the Championships in the fall of 2009.

Awards: The Top 3 teams/pairs overall will receive gold, silver, bronze medallions. Members of each qualifying team/pair will receive a lapel pin in recognition of their qualifying score. Rosettes will be given to 1st - 4th placements

Grand Prix of Dog Agility® and Performance National StandardSM

These single-round tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level. A qualifying score is zero faults. One Q is required for entry in a Regional Championships where a bye into the semifinals may be earned. Two qualifying scores are required for entry in the quarterfinals at the World Championships.

Awards

First place qualifying winner in each height class shall be awarded a “bye voucher”, permitting them to advance to the final round of a regional championship. A double overlay ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers. 1st – 4th place ribbons will be awarded in each jump height.

Dog Agility Steeplechase®, and Performance Speed JumpingSM

These two-round tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level.

Steeplechase: One qualifying score as described in the complete rules is required for entry in a Regional Championships, and two are required for entry in the quarterfinals at the World Championships. **Speed Jumping:** Two qualifying scores as described in the complete rules are required for entry in the semifinals at the World Championships.

Awards (Steeplechase):

Local Qualifiers: Prize money shall be computed based upon 30% of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class. 1st-4th place rosettes will be awarded in Round 1.
