ENTRIES AND CLOSING DATE

All entries must be received by 6 pm on Friday, September 3rd. To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or legal guardian if handler is a minor), received by the closing date, and accompanied by the correct fees. You must file a separate entry form if you enter more than one dog (i.e., only one dog per form). Advancement in levels will be accepted IN WRITING no later than 6 pm on Monday, September 13, via email valwaussies@comcast.net (preferred) or phone (603) 289-5169. Email is preferred and no calls before 9 am or after 9 pm. All telephone calls will be returned collect.

Please read your Confirmation letters. ANY corrections made after the above dates will incur a \$25.00 fee PER change, payable in cash prior to the running of your dog(s).

REGISTRATION OF DOGS

All dogs must be registered with USDAA® (registration has a "U" prefix) in order to compete. The registration form included with this Agility Test Schedule must be completed and submitted with any entry that does not bear a valid USDAA® registration number. To get a registration number immediately and a height card prior to the trial, go online to www.usdaa.com and click on General Information, Dog Registration.

CHECK-IN and STARTING TIMES

Competitor set-up begins Friday, September 17, at 3:00 pm. Check-in will be from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm Friday for those not requiring measurement and from 7:00 am to 7:30 am on Saturday and Sunday. Sunday check-in is only for dogs not present on Saturday. Judge's briefing will begin at 7:45 am each day, with the first class starting promptly at 8:00 am. All competitors must check in their first day of competition.

<u>All</u> dogs must be measured unless they are jumping 26" (22" in Perf), the hander presents a permanent (yellow) registration card, temporary (blue) measurement card with 3 measurements awaiting a CMJ, or check-in letter from USDAA / print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded. Notification of early measurement on Friday will be sent with confirmation.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rules and regulations promulgated by the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. are to be strictly applied at this event. Competitors are expected to be familiar with the rules and regulations. The rules may be viewed online at www.usdaa.com.

AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to all dogs placing 1st through 4th in each jump height of most classes as well as in Pairs in the mini and open divisions. In each Starters and Performance I classes, ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 6th place. All qualifying scores will be awarded a maroon qualifying ribbon. New Title rosettes will be awarded for most new titles earned at this trial. All prizes and awards must be claimed prior to the end of the trial. Sorry, no ribbons will be mailed.

In the Grand Prix, a double overlay maroon and white ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers. In Performance Grand Prix, a double overlay maroon and pink ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers. Rosettes will be awarded 1st through 4th places in each jump height.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA's rules and regulations including, but not limited to, the following rules regarding entry:

- This test is open to all dogs at least 18 months of age, including non-purebred and purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dogs ability to perform safely, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- Mo leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Safety shall be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers through entry of this event accept full responsibility for themselves and the actions of their dog(s) and/or children.
- ★ Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA rules and regulations.
- The organizing committee may refuse any entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee doing so must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility of appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, weather, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizer or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. A dog or handler who suffers an injury and/or illness or bitches that come into season after the closing date may be eligible for a 50% refund of their total entry fee. Requests for refunds must be received IN WRITING by the Test Secretary by the completion of the event on Sunday, September 19. Please include documentation from your veterinarian or physician verifying the illness or injury.
- Returned checks do no constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$25 service charge for returned checks and \$10 fee for foreign checks not drawn on a U.S. based bank or via Traveler's Cheques or International Money Orders. All funds are payable in U.S. dollars. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is cancelled without recourse by owner/handler.
- ★ Separate confirmation letters will not be sent for advancements in level.
- Make All dogs must be kept on leash while on the show grounds except when competing in the ring.
- ₩ No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated areas.
- Everyone is expected to pick up after their dog(s). Any competitor not cleaning up after his or her dog(s) at the trial site or hotel will be asked to leave. No entry fees will be refunded to any competitor asked to leave due to failure to clean up after their dog(s).
- This event will be held outdoors in two rings on a grass surface with snow fencing. Electronic timing will be used. Bring your own chair and shade. Wading pools and hoses to cool off dogs will be provided.
- ₩ There shall be no familiarization at this event.
- Fault limits may be applied in any classes for which faults are assessed. The need for such limits shall be announced during the judge's briefing.
- Entries "For Exhibition Only" (F.E.O.) shall not be allowed. If a dog measures up at this trial it will be placed first in the running order for each class entered. The dog may not be moved to Performance.
- Mismatched or incomplete pairs or team entries shall be accepted as draw entries only.
- Mo corporate logos other than those of USDAA®, it's sponsors, or USDAA® member groups are permitted in the ring at any time.
- All competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape or purchase videotape of portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial exhibition purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- All vendors must register with Mark Wirant at events@k9logix.com or 603-399-4491 before 9 pm. Vendor fee will be \$25 per day or donated items of similar value for the worker raffle each day.
- ★ Food will be available on site.
- >> Please check your math. Overpayment of entry fees will not be refunded and underpayment of fees will not constitute a valid entry form.

MOTELS THAT ACCEPT DOGS:

We highly recommend that you make your hotel reservations as soon as possible and verify that pets are still accepted. Motels that accept dogs are far and few between. Please be responsible so we can continue using these motels by following the guidelines below:

- ★ Keep your dog on leash at all times.
- ★ Pick up after your dog.
- Make Please don't groom or bathe your dog at the motel
- Leave a special tip for the housekeeper who will have to vacuum the dog hair and to keep the staff happy!
- m Don't leave your dog alone in your room. Even the nicest dogs have barking parties when left alone.
- Bring sheets to cover the bed(s).
- You will be asked to leave the competition and/or qualifying scores revoked if hotel managers advise us of any competitor who was disruptive to hotel patrons or did not clean up after their dogs.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE: FRANKLIN COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS, 89 WISDOM WAY, GREENFIELD, MA

<u>From I-91 Rotary (Exit 26):</u> **Follow Rt. 2A through two sets of lights. At the second set of lights, make a RIGHT (at Dunkin Donuts) onto River Street. Take your third RIGHT onto Wisdom Way – a sharp right. Follow to front entrance of fairgrounds on your RIGHT. **From Route 2 East**: Follow Rt. 2 to I-91 South and follow directions above**.

From Route 2 West: Go around rotary and pick up Route 2A. Follow directions above**.

From Routes 5 & 10 South: After you enter Greenfield go through two sets of lights. At second set of lights make a LEFT onto Mill Street. Go over bridge and take immediate LEFT onto Wisdom Way. Follow to front entrance of fairgrounds on your RIGHT.

From Routes 5 & 10 North: Turns into Federal Street, which takes you to Main Street in Greenfield. Go straight at the Main Street intersection (still Federal Street). Federal Street then becomes Bank Row. At the bottom of the hill is an underpass and stop light. Bear RIGHT at the light onto Mill Street. Follow Mill Street to bridge. After the bridge, take an immediate LEFT onto Wisdom Way to fairgrounds entrance on the RIGHT.

CLASSES OFFERED

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship and Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e., standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

CHAMPIONSHIP PROGRAM CLASSES

The **Starters Standard** classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the Agility Dog ® title or a Starters Standard title. **Starters non-standard** classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay – 3 different partners required – or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the Starters level classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the Agility Dog® title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Agility Dog® title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Advanced Agility Dog® title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title or the Advanced Standard title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

PERFORMANCE PROGRAM CLASSES

Generally, Performance Level 1, Level II, and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced, and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard and jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The **Performance I Standard** class shall be for any dog that has not earned the *Performance Dog I* title, the *Performance Standard I* title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III Standard classes. **Performance I non**-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (*Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker*) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level.

The **Performance II Standard** classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog I* title, the *Performance Standard I* title, the Agility Dog® title or the *Veteran Agility Dog* title, but has not earned the *Performance Dog II* title or *Performance Standard II* title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. **Performance II non-standard** classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog I* title, the Agility Dog® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class.

The **Performance III Standard** classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog II* title, the *Performance Standard II* title, the Advanced Agility Dog® title, or the Veteran Advanced Agility Dog® title. **Performance III non-standard** classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog II* title, the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay, and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3-7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

<u>Standard classes</u> consist of a sequentially numbered course containing an A-frame, Dog Walk, See-saw, Open tunnel(s), Closed Tunnel, Table, Tire Jump, Weaves, Spread jump, and various Hurdle Jumps. Championship Standard classes are scored pursuant to the provision of Chapter 3 (Masters). Chapter 4 (Advanced), and Chapter 5 (Starters). Generally, Performance Level 1, Level II, and Level III classes are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program and scored identically with the following exceptions: no spread hurdles are utilized, and time standards are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program.

<u>Gamblers classes</u> consist of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening" period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening" the handler attempts the "gamble", a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points. This non-standard course is pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

<u>Jumpers classes</u> consist of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This non-standard course is pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

<u>Snooker classes</u> has an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. This non-standard course is pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

<u>Pairs Relay classes</u> consist of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. Partners must be in the same level and same height division, mini Championship 12/16", Performance 8/12") or open (Championship 22/26", Performance 16/22"). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from other programs/levels may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. This non-standard class is pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

2011 GRAND PRIX OF DOG AGILITY® WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS & PERFORMANCE GRAND PRIXSM - LOCAL QUALIFIERS (Information below is provided for general reference only. Complete rules will be posted at the event)

These tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level. Both are a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard agility, except that no table obstacle shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied. Competitors must have a ZERO fault round to earn a qualifying score for which qualifying ribbons are presented. One qualifying score is required for entry in Round 1 of a Regional Championships. Two qualifying scores required for entry into the quarterfinals at the World Championships.

AWARDS: Competitors that earn ZERO faults shall earn a qualifying score. In addition, the first place qualifying handler/dog team in each height class shall earn a "bye" voucher, permitting them to directly advance to the final round of a regional championship. A double maroon and white ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers.

QUALIFICATION and ADVANCEMENT FOR BOTH TOURNAMENTS: Competitors that earn ZERO faults shall earn a qualifying score. Additionally, the first place competitor in each height class who has earned a qualifying score shall be eligible to enter the final round of a Type 1 Regional Championship without regard to their score in the first round. Such eligibility shall be documented through a "bye" voucher. A competitor may earn more than one voucher, and the voucher is non-transferable, can be used only once and must be submitted with the competitor's entry form for a Type 1 Regional Championship. See complete rules and regulations for Regional Championships, which are hereby incorporated by reference. The rules may be found on the USDAA web site – General Information – Forms and Documents Library, or may be requested in writing by US mail from the USDAA office. A competitor must have two qualifications, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship, in order to qualify for entry to the world championship. A competitor may choose to compete in both Grand Prix and Performance Grand Prix qualifiers during the current tournament season; however, the competitor is only eligible to compete in the championships of the tournament in which they have earned the most qualifications. Further, 2011 tournament rules stipulate that a competitor must compete all in Championship or all in Performance tournaments at Regional and National/World Championship events.

2011 DOG AGILITY STEEPLECHASE® LOCAL QUALIFIER & PERFORMANCE SPEED JUMPINGSM QUALIFIERS (Information below is provided for general reference only. Complete rules will be posted at the event)

These tournaments are open to all dogs regardless of titles earned or level of competition. A dog may not be entered in both Steeplechase and Speed Jumping at this event. A qualifying score is earned in Round 1, with dog advancing to Round 2 to compete for prize money and tournament top ten points.

Regional Championships: A competitor must have one qualification at a local qualifier to be eligible to enter Round 1 of a Regional Championships.

World Championships:

- Quarterfinals: Two qualifications, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship will be required for entry.
- <u>Semifinals:</u> A 'bye' for direct entry into the semifinals at the World Championships may be earned by earning the equivalent of a qualifying score in Round 2 of a Regional Championship. The same process used for determining qualifying scores in Round 1 will be applied to scores from Round 2 to determine the maximum qualifying score for Round 2. Any 'bye' that is earned may only be used by the handler/dog team who earned it and may not be transferred to another dog and/or handler.

Awards:

<u>Local Qualifiers</u>: Prize money shall be computed based upon 20% to 40% (at club's discretion) of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class.
