Directions to the Site: From the North:

On Routes 5 & 10 which turn into Federal Street and take you to Main St. in Greenfield. Go straight at the Main St. intersection. Federal St. becomes Bank Row. At the bottom of the hill is an underpass and stop light. Bear RIGHT at the light onto Mill St. Follow Mill St. and cross the bridge. After the bridge, take an immediate LEFT onto Wisdom Way to the fairgrounds entrance on the RIGHT.

From the South:

On Routes 5 & 10. After you enter Greenfield, go through two sets of lights. At the second set of lights, turn LEFT onto Mill St. Go over the bridge and take an immediate LEFT onto Wisdom Way. Follow to front entrance of fairgrounds on your RIGHT.

From the East:

On Route 2, follow Rt. 2 to I-91 South and exit at Rotary, Exit 26. Follow Rt 2A East toward Greenfield through two sets of lights. At the second set of lights, turn RIGHT onto River St. Take your third RIGHT (sharp right) onto Wisdom Way. Follow to the front entrance of the fairgrounds on your RIGHT.

From the West:

On Route 2; go around Rotary and pick up Route 2A East toward Greenfieldfollowing it through two sets of lights. At the second set of lights, turn RIGHT onto River St. Take your third RIGHT (hard right) onto Wisdom Way. Follow to front entrance of fairgrounds on your RIGHT.

Check-in & Measuring

Dog Measurements & Certification

All dogs not jumping 24" in the Championship Program or 20" in the Performance Program at local and regional events must be measured unless they have permanent USDAA or World Cynosport Dog Registration status or a temporary card with 3 signatures as required by the regulations, making the dog eligible for their jump height (prior to 3 years of age). Please note that only dogs 18 months of age may be officially measured.

Team & Versatility Pairs Measure-up Policy - FEO

A dog entered in 3-dog or 2-dog (pairs) Dog Agility Masters[®] team tournament is required to jump an eligible height as measured for the Championship or Performance programs. Should a dog on a 3-dog team be measured up to a higher height by virtue of the judge's measurement ,causing a violation of the two-height limitation on 3-dog teams, the competitor and/or judge must notify the secretary prior to the start of the evnet so that teams may be realigned from available dogs to comply with the two-height limitation.

In the event the competitor is unprepared to run their dog at a legal Championship or Performance program height, they may run in the tournament For Exhibition Only, noting that no team member may earn team placements or qualification; other members of the team that jump an eligible height in the tournament's individual classes may earn qualifications and/or points for those classes for purpose of individual placements, top ten and Lifetime Achievement awards

A Dog that Measures Up at Check-In - May Run FEO

If a judge's measurement of a dog at check-in establishes that the dog is ineligible for the height class in which entered, the competitor may

- Run the dog at the higher height in the same program based upon the measurement,
- Modify the entry to enroll the dog in the proper height class in the Performance Program,
- Modify the entry to enroll the dog in the proper height class in the Veterans Program if the dog is 8 years old
- Run For Exhibition Only (FEO) at the next lowest jump height, but only in the program entered.

Because entry into a higher height is permitted in the Performance and Championship Programs, a dog measuring lower may not be moved to a lower height in either program.

Team & Versatility Pairs Measure-up Policy

The handler of a dog entered in Team or Versatility Pairs must notify the secretary immediately should their dog be required to jump a higher height by virtue of the judge's measurement. The dog must jump the higher jump height in order to be eligible to earn a qualifying score in the tournament. If entered in Team, the dog that measured up may be moved to Versatility Pairs. If the handler chooses *not* to have their dog jump the higher height or move to PVP, their entry is effectively withdrawn. The competitor may or may not run for exhibition only (earning no individual class qualifications or tournament qualification for the team) solely at the discretion of the event secretary; there shall be no refund of fees paid.

If the change in height makes the dog ineligible for their team (three jump heights), the secretary will make every effort to form complete teams from dogs available. A move-up in height for dogs in Versatility Pairs does not affect their team composition, but may result in a change in their position in the running order because of the height composition of the Pair.

Class Descriptions

Titling Class Rules & Descriptions

One or more titling classes may be held at this Event as described in Chapters 3 - 8 of USDAA Official Rules & Regulations, which are downloadable from www.usdaa.com/regulations/usdaa-rules-and-regulations.cfm. When held, these regulations and any amendments there to are hereby incorporated by reference.

Tournament Class Rules & Descriptions

One or more tournament classes may be held at this event. See tournament rules for the description, rules, and start and end dates for the current tournament season qualifying period. Rules for all tournaments may be downloaded on the Internet at http://www.usdaa.com. Highlights of the Tournament Regulations are included in a separate note under Class Descriptions. Qualifications in tournament classes count towards versatility titles and Lifetime Achievement Awards.

2022 Tournament Season Regulations

The tournament qualifying season for Cynosport[®] 2022 shall run from September 10, 2021 – September 30, 2022. Cynosport 2022 is scheduled for Scottsdale, Arizona, November 30 – December 4.

Eligibility for entry to Cynosport[®] 2022 will require that a competitor pre-qualify in at least one tournament. Entry to each tournament requires two qualifications to be earned at local and/or regional events during the qualifing season. A single wild card qualification (five qualifications in the core titling classes) may be substituted for one qualification in one tournament.

Local event qualifying criteria remains unchanged in all significant respects, and the 10" height division will remain as an available jump height for dogs measuring 12" or less.

Competitors may earn "Byes" into the Cynosport® 2022 Semifinals of the Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships and the \$10,000 Dog Agility Steeplechase® by competing and meeting the Bye criteria in the final round at a Regional Championship during the 2022 tournament season. The number of regional championships and their locations will be announced on or before November 30, 2021. A Bye earns a competitor the right to bypass the Quarterfinal rounds in the Grand Prix of Dog Agility and the Dog Agility Steeplechase at Cynosport 2022. Competitors who previously earned Byes at a 2020 Regional

Championship but did not compete in Cynosport 2021 may use that Bye in Cynosport 2022 for the tournament in which the Bye was earned.

The Dog Agility Masters® tournament shall continue to be offered on a combined program basis, with local event hosts offering the tournament in either the 2-dog or 3-dog format. All Regional Championships and Cynosport 2022 are planned to offer both formats, providing the opportunity for competitors to team up as 2-dog or 3-dog teams.

Qualifications in tournaments offered through USDAA@Home! SM events are for title qualification only and do not satisfy tournament eligibility requirements for entry to Cynosport®.

Final regulations for the 2022 tournament season will be available on or before September 1, 2021, and shall be posted to the USDAA website. Should events be preempted due to pandemic-related causes or other matters beyond our control, requirements are subject to change.

Entries & Acceptance

Policy on Refusal of Entry

The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the Committee view that participation by the competitor or dog could be prejudicial to the sport. However, in such case, the Committee must notify the competitor in writing upon receipt of entry, but in no case, more than three days following the event closing date for acceptance of entries. The burden of responsibility for the appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.

NSF Check/Credit Card

Any check or credit card that is charged back by the bank or other financial institution may be assessed a service charge of up to \$40 per incident at the discretion of the host group.

Returned checks or credit card returns do not constitute a valid entry. Amounts shall be paid within 30 day of postmarked notice of the returned payment if such date follows the event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice will result in cancellation of event results for all classes related to the entry for which payment was made. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution.

Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event, or entry is canceled without recourse.

Refund Policy

There shall be NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date for acceptance of entries, for absentee, dismissal from the event as a result of disciplinary action, dismissal from a class, or for any other reason. Also, no entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, acts of terrorism, fire, "act of God", public emergency, strike, or any other cause beyond the control of the host organization.

Spam Blocker

Confirmations will be sent via email using the secretary's address. If you have a spam blocker on your email account, please configure it to allow email from the secretary's address since confirmations will be sent from this account.

General Rule on Eligibility

This event is sanctioned by the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. ("USDAA").

This test is open to all persons with dogs being at least 18 months of age (14 months of age pursuant to Chapter 10 for Intro Program when offered OR for Sanctioned Match), regardless of pedigree or absence thereof, who have a current registration with USDAA and whose owners and the dog's handler are currently in good standing with USDAA.

This event will be held under USDAA® Official Rules and Regulations, a copy of which may be viewed and printed online at <u>USDAA Rules & Regulations</u>, as amended.

Submission of Entries with Secondary Move-Up Date

All entries or cancellations must be received at the Secretary's address no later than the closing date, after which time no entries will be accepted or cancelled. For entries received by the closing date, the level of entry into a given class may be advanced by notifying the Secretary in writing via email by the "Secondary Closing Date". No other changes, cancellations or additions may be made after the initial closing date.

To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or legal guardian if handler is a minor), received by the closing date and accompanied by the correct fees and include a valid USDAA registration number on a completed registration form.

Express & Overnight Entries

Entries sent by Fedex, Express Mail or other courier service will only be accepted if the waiver allowing delivery **without signature** is signed. The club will not be responsible for deliveries delayed if a signature is required.

Bitches In Season

"PAWS allows Bitches in Season to complete in all classes when running in britches. The competitor must notify the trial secretary and the gate sheets will indicate the BIS. BIS will run in their assigned run order."

General Entry Conditions

Policy on Fault Limits

In the event of a larger entry, fault limits may be set at the discretion of the Organizing Committee and/or Judge without pre-event notice.

Statement of Responsibility

Competitors alone are responsible for the behavior of themselves, their dogs, children, and guests. A competitor whose dogs, children or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Organizing Committee, be asked to leave the test site.

Prohibitions on Aids & Devices

No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time, except as provided for in Chapter 10 when Intro Program classes are offered, or in Chapter 8 when Junior Handler Program classes are offered.

Fix & Continue Will Be Allowed At This Event

The USDAA Policy Statement on Training in the Ring or "Fix & Continue" has been adopted for this event and is hereby incorporated in its entirety by reference. Competitors are expected to familiarize themselves with this policy, which can be found on the USDAA web site at Official USDAA PolicyStatements.

Fix & Continue during a competition run generally provides for repeat of an obstacle at handler's discretion under conditions set forth in the Policy Statement. When discretion is exercised to utilize the Fix & Continue, their score will be recorded as an elimination and the maximum course time set to 60 seconds. This practice may be utilized only once in any Standard, Jumpers, or Relay class (including similarly-styled tournament classes at qualifying events). The competitor must continue working the course in flow, while "fixing" and "continuing" on the course. See the Policy Statement referenced above for complete details.

Mulligan Runs

Based upon the number of runs per day at this trial Mulligan Runs may be available for one or more classes each day. The Show Committee shall determine in which class(es) a Mulligan Run will be allowed. Availability and cost for each run shall be announced in final confirmations. Only competitors entered in the class are eliqible for a Mulligan Run per USDAA policy which is hereby incorporated by reference.

A competitor must sign up and pay for their Mulligan Run immediately following their titling run (if they didn't sign up/pay for a Mulligan Run prior) and prior to the completion of the class. A Mulligan Run sign-up sheet will be made available. When Mulligans are running concurrently with another ring at an event, only silent toys are allowed and may not be tossed. Food, treats, training aids are not allowed.

Running a Class "For Exhibition Only" (FEO) at Local Events

A competitor may enter a class at a local event (events other than regional, national and international championship or special events) and declare on the day of the event that they are going to run "For Exhibition Only" (FEO). Declaring "For Exhibition Only" requires that-

- the Gate Steward, or the Competitor in the absence of a gate steward, clearly mark "FEO" by the competitor's entry number on the posted running order
- the Competitor vocally declares to the Judge and Scribe, "FEO", when advancing to the start line
- the Scribe clearly marks "FEO" on the scribe sheet
- the Scorekeeper records the round as "Withdrawn", denoting the round as a noncompeting round in the official results and shall be ineligible for awards

Additionally,

- non-audible toys are allowed but must be used in a manner that does not distract other dogs running in adjacent rings
- the dog shall be run at the height at which it was entered.
- the maximum time on course allowable is the Standard Course Time (SCT); however, the judge, in their sole discretion, may dismiss a competitor from the ring for any behaviors that are deemed unsafe or harsh, or that do not present the sport in a positive way.

Evolving COVID-19 & General Health Safety Measures

The health environment nationwide related to COVID-19 is continuing to evolve as cases appears to be on rapid decline in many parts of the country. With relaxation or rescinding of mask and social distancing mandates trending, competitors, show organizers, and guests are urged to remain respectful of individual choices and varied practices that may occur. USDAA recognizes that the biology for each person is different with respect to any illness and each may have preferences on what is necessary for them to return to open events.

Groups may set specific requirements for their events as they deem necessary to provide a safe and enjoyable event for competitors. Any stipulated requirements shall be set forth in a note in the test schedule for the event and should be posted at check-in for the event as a reminder. Competitors shall expect that a host Group shall enforce whatever rules they set in place pursuant to USDAA Disciplinary Rules published in USDAA rules & regulations.

Each person attending this event as an official, volunteer, or competitor shall be responsible for and assume liability for their own decisions regarding health risk, and each person shall be accountable for their actions relative to any procedures in effect:

- Maintaining social distancing (of both you and your dog) from others
- Wearing a mask or gloves
- Awareness of items that they touch and may have been touched by others
- Wash hands and/or use of hand sanitizers
- Enjoyment of food and refreshments, if provided

Please be accepting of changes from past practices as we seek enjoyment in a safe environment for all.

By all means, if you have been exposed to anyone that may have been exposed or infected with a virus or flu or any other contagious illness within two weeks prior to the event, or if you are feeling ill, please take responsibility and stay home and rest, knowing that we will happily welcome you at a future events.

Additional health and/or safety measures may required by the facility owner at which this event is being held, or by the Event Organizer. Such statements may be included in this test schedule, in the event confirmation, or posted on site at Check-In for this event. Failure to comply with these requirements, as well as other provisions in this test schedule are subject to disciplinary action as described in Appendix C to USDAA Official Rules & Regulations, which could result in dismissal from the event and/or cancellation of all results from performance at the event, without recourse.

Title Rosettes will also be awarded for completion of AD, PD, AAD, APD, MAD, MPD, ADCH, PDCH AND Lifetime Achievements.

TOURNAMENTS:

Grand Prix & PGP: 1st through 3th place Rosettes will be awarded in each jump height. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded for each qualifying score.

Steeplechase & PSJ: Qualifying ribbons will be awarded. 1st through 4th place Rosettes will be awarded in each jump height. Go to www.usdaa.com for cash prize rules.

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals are given to the top 3 teams, Rosettes are also awarded.

General Agreement

1.1 - Consideration and Waiver & Acceptance of Liability

IN CONSIDERATION OF the acceptance of this entry and the opportunity to participate and/or to be judged in the event on the dates to which this entry form applies (the "Event"), I undertand and willingly accept that there are inherent risks in participating in sporting events, including but not limited to risks associated with events involving animals.
