#### There is a \$1 Website Fee and a 3.52% Processing Fee

- These fees apply to all trial entries created on this system.
- The Website Fee is always \$1 for your entire trial entry. It doesn't matter how many dogs you have or how many days you enter.
- The Processing Fee is applied to your Trial Entry Fee plus the Website Fee.
- These fees are not refundable.

#### There are Two Ways to Enter a Trial

- **Full Online Entry** – select your classes online and pay by credit card. No paper needed!
- **Online Paper Entry** – select your classes online and download a pre-filled PDF to mail with a check.

#### There is a Cash Discount

- If you pay with cash or mail a check, then you will receive the 3.4% Cash Discount.
- If you pay from your My Dog Entry online account or use a Club Coupon, then you will also receive the Cash Discount.
- You can fund your My Dog Entry online account using the Zelle service.

**This will be a CONCURRENT Event using a BLOCK schedule. NO RUN ORDER! A time block will be assigned if not selected upon entry.**

FastCAT events are open to all dogs one (1) year of age and older & that are registered with the AKC, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number and dogs enrolled in the Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate.

If your mixed breed dog needs an AKC Canine Partner number, the information is below to pay by credit card and receive your registration number instantly. Your dog **MUST BE** spayed or neutered to receive a Canine Partner number!

**Hours** Grounds are available a half hour prior to event hours and during lunch. Event hours are usually 9:00AM-4:00PM or until all runs are completed. Volunteers will run first at 9:00. It is the responsibility of each entrant to be ready with catcher & releaser when they are called to the line.

**Collar Rules:** Dogs may run without a collar or wear any type of collar except choker collars, electronic training collars or head collar. Collars should be snug. **Hanging tags pose a safety concern and they should be taped or removed.** Dogs may run muzzled if desired. Clips or rubber bands may be used to keep long hair from falling across the dog's field of vision.

**No Open toe shoes or bare feet allowed anywhere on the course!**

**Check in & Inspection.** Check in/Inspection starts 15 minutes prior to the beginning of the event and each time block or throughout the event. Every dog must pass through inspection before each run. Dogs who miss their time block will be skipped. If you do not check in within one hour prior to the end of the event closing, we will assume you are absent. No refunds for absent dogs. At inspection, all dogs will be examined for disqualifications. Bitches known to be in season are not to be brought to the test. At inspection, bitches in season, lame and unfit dogs will be excused with **entry refunded minus a \$3.25 service fee per run.**

**Refunds: You may pull out of the event prior to closing date/time for a refund minus a \$3.25 service fee per entry run per dog for any reason. After closing only Bitches in season or dogs found to be lame/unfit at inspection will be given the same refund policy. There will be no refund after closing for any other reason.**

**Prizes:** A flat light blue ribbon for a passing qualifying run. Rosettes for completing titles BCAT, DCAT or FCAT, as available. **Please notify the Event Secretary if you anticipate completing a title** by circling on the bottom of the entry form or checking the appropriate box on the Online Form.

### What is FastCAT?

1. FastCAT is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs.
2. Dogs are held at the start line and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow, chasing it to the finish line and into a catch pen. The course is completely fenced, and dogs are run individually.
3. Dogs are timed when they complete the 100-yard dash. The time is converted to Miles Per Hour (MPH).
4. Based on the dog's size at the withers a handicap is applied and points are earned:
5. 18" or greater = Handicap is 1.0
6. 12" up to less than 18" = Handicap is 1.5.
7. Under 12" = Handicap is 2.0.
8. FORMULA: MPH X HANDICAP = POINTS
9. Titles are earned at specific point levels.

BCAT = 150 points, DCAT = 500 points, FCAT = 1,000 points  
FCAT# = Each additional 500 points

**\*AKC RULES:** Handlers are not allowed to run on course with a dog or prior to their run. Handlers are not to entice the dog through the course with items other than the lure. NO mechanical devices, including whistles, horns, etc., NO toys including the waving of objects to lure the dog to the finish line. You MAY CHEER and use the dog's name. Food or toys can only be shown AFTER the dog crosses the finish line to help catch the dog.

### DIRECTIONS TO THE SITE

#### Directions to Washington County Fairgrounds:

**From North and South** – Take I-87 (Adirondack Northway) to Exit 14. Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 East. Take Route 29 East through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds is on the left.

**From Western NY** – Take I-90 East (NYS Thruway) to Exit 24 (Albany). Take I-87 North (Adirondack Northway) to Exit 14. Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 East. Take Route 29 East through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds is on the left.

**From East-** Take the MASS Turnpike to NYS Thruway. Take NYS Thruway to Exit B1 (Albany) Follow I-90 to exit 7 (I-787 North). Follow I-787 North to exit 7. Follow Route 7 West to the intersection of I-87 North (Adirondack Northway) to Exit 14. Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 East. Take Route 29 East through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds is on the left.

No shade will be available. Be sure to bring shade and water for your dog! Please, park in the parking lot following any posted signs and directions and walk up to the sign-in table. Please have both catcher & releaser so that you may go directly to the line to run while the catcher goes directly to the catch pen area.



## Event Information

Dogs should be warmed up before and cooled down after running.

- ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNER'S SOLE RISK
- All entries must be 12 months of age or older on the day of the test.
- All AKC rules regarding sportsmanship and conduct apply.
- This is a rain-or-shine outdoor event. Please plan accordingly.
- An electric and electronic timing system will be used.
- The show grounds are not completely fenced. The FAST CAT course will be fenced with orange snow fencing and or mesh fencing material.
- Dogs must be on lead or crated unless running.
- You are responsible for controlling your dog(s) and children.
- Each dog requires an individual entry form for each event it is entered.
- The Hunt master is responsible for field safety and therefore he/she is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. He/She has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve the dog on the course.
- Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to the AKC, dog(s) or person(s) will be asked to leave the event site by the Field Committee. They may be disciplined by the AKC, and **entry fees will not be refunded.**
- **No entry fees will be refunded** if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- The event-hosting club, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.
- **The Catch pen depth will be determined by the site. A minimum of 50 yds is standard but usually a 60 yd plus measurement is used. This site allows for a 70-yard catch pen.**
- A continuous loop course will be used as in the AKC diagram shown here.

## About Salukis

Known for its grace, elegance, and remarkable speed, the Saluki was highly valued as a hunting companion by nomadic tribes inhabiting the “Fertile Crescent” cradle of civilization. Evidence of salukis exists as far back as ancient Mesopotamia, where skeletal remains, artifacts, depictions of similar-looking dogs suggest they existed as early as 7,000 BCE.

The Saluki breed was held in great esteem, called “el Hor” (the Noble One) by tribal Arabs, they had the same status as Arabian horses and falcons. They were highly prized for their hunting speed and ability to cover vast distances on caravan treks in harsh environmental conditions. Valued and honored companion to Egyptian nobility, the Saluki was depicted on tomb walls and known to be mummified like the Egyptian Pharaohs.

The Saluki occupies a unique position in the lives of its Middle Eastern, often Bedouin owners. Ordinary dogs are considered “unclean” and may not be touched, but the Saluki is permitted into the tents of nomads and the courtyards of settled breeders. Salukis of the Bedouin brought down gazelle, bustard, hare, and other prey in desert terrain — but were trained to hold the game until their master arrived to deliver the coup de grace. Often, they would hunt gazelle in tandem with trained falcons.

Over the millennia, Salukis spread from Mesopotamia and Egypt along the Silk Road to China. Variations of this ancient breed were found in desert cultures from Egypt and Sinai to Iraq and Iran. The Saluki retains high esteem even today and continues to be used for hunting in most of the regions where it traditionally worked, side by side with its master.

During the Crusades and Renaissance merchant expeditions, Salukis were imported to Europe and can be seen in tapestries and paintings. European nobility kept them as both pet-souvenirs of their travel to the Middle East and status symbols.
