Trial Site & Information

The show site is indoors on turf. Please bring your own crate, clean up supplies, & water for your dog.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the ring. Exercise and toilet your dog in designated areas. Please scoop poop and use garbage containers on the site. Please be courteous to others using the area. **Please do not allow your dog to potty on the building, the artificial turf between the buildings, or the A/C units.**

No aggressive dogs.

A warmup jump will be provided for all exhibitors.

Trial Site Rules

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. **NO SMOKING** inside of the building or near the doors.

NEW Galican LITE single cup jumps, Ascending Spread jump, Broad Jump, Tire and Rubberized Contacts will be used.

Bitches in Season

May run at this trial. To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary. The BIS **will remain in their running order** and BIS will be designated next to the name on the running orders. **BIS pants must be worn** whenever the dog is in one of the main agility rings or on the matting in the crating building. The handler/owner acknowledges the inherent risk of running a dog on an agility course with BIS pants on and assumes all risk by doing so.

Day of Show Entry Information

ONLY allowed for NON-FESTIVAL EVENT Classes.

Your entry must be submitted to the Trial Secretary prior to walking the course. Day of Show entries for the first class of the day must be submitted to the Trial Secretary no less than 15 minutes prior to the start of the show to allow time for paperwork to be processed before judging begins.

1. Assumption of Risk & Liability

By entering this event, the handler/owner certifies that any and all dogs brought to the event, whether participating or not, do not pose a hazard to persons, dogs, or property.

As the owner of any dog entered in this event, its duly authorized agent or handler of any dog (collectively, the “Handler”), and in consideration of participation in this event, the Handler agree(s) to adhere to UK Agility International rules and regulations and any additional rules and regulations that may be set forth herein (the “Rules”). By entering this event, Handler hereby agrees to indemnify and hold UK Agility International and UK Agility, Ltd., (collectively, “UKI”), their agents, officers, directors and employees, event hosts, trial secretary, judges and their assistants, harmless from and against any and all losses and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees and costs) that may be imposed upon it or them, resulting from Handler’s participation in this event, including but not limited to any claims or demands for loss or injury alleged to have been caused to any equipment or any dog or person while in attendance at this event, and to accept full responsibility therefor.

2. Hazards & Safety

Handler acknowledges all potential hazards associated with the training facility, event, and premises, including but not limited to:

- The condition of the grounds
- Lighting and security measures (or lack thereof)
- Electrical appliances and fittings
- Parking areas, camping areas and fencing
- The potential for a dog to escape from the training or competition area
- The presence of unfamiliar animals and people
- The presence of other dogs
- The risk of exposure to illness
- Agility equipment
- Course design and course set up
- Weather conditions including any other ‘Acts of God’

By entering, Handler voluntarily assumes any and all risks associated with these hazards and any other potential hazards not listed. All participants must exercise caution, monitor their dogs, and clean up after themselves and their animals.

3. Conduct & Enforcement

UK Agility International reserves the right to:

- Excuse any participant for what it deems excessive harshness toward a dog and for behavior considered aggressive or abusive toward another person or dog.
- Revoke, suspend, or ban any entry or membership in its sole discretion if deemed necessary to protect the interests of UKI and any of its associates, agents, officers, or members.

Participation in UKI events, including membership, is a PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT. UK Agility International has full authority to impose suspensions or bans upon any member without prior notice.

4. Rules & Regulations

By entering, Handler agrees to comply with all UK Agility International Rules & Regulations, including any amendments. Additionally, Handler confirms that:

- Handler will not bring any dog that has been exposed to an infectious or contagious disease within 21 days prior to the event.
- To the best of Handler’s knowledge, your dog is not subject to disqualification under UK Agility International show regulations.
- Handler accepts full responsibility for the safety of both Handler and Handler’s dog(s).

Measuring Dogs

Please ensure you understand the criteria regarding dogs being measured. Refer to the current edition rule book which can be found on the UKI web page. [UKI 11th Edition Rule Book.pdf](#) A summary of the rules can also be found here [Jump Heights | UK Agility International](#)

If a dog is under 3 and newly registered, a temporary measure or proof of the dog's height must be done by the dog's 3rd trial. A permanent measure must be obtained by a UKI official measurer between 12-18 months after the dog's first/ temporary measure. Any registered dog that only has a temporary measure, must follow the above rule. If a newly registered dog is over 3, they must obtain a measure by an official UKI measurer by their 3rd trial and this measurement will be permanent.

Level Move-ups

Exhibitors are responsible for tracking their dog's points in each of the two UKI programs and must move their dog to the next eligible level on the following day of a multiple-day trial once sufficient points have been earned. Competitors must notify the trial secretary on the day their dog gains enough points to move up in a particular program. Exhibitors may log into their UKI account to confirm and tally points. Please consult the UKI rule book for detailed information on level requirements.

UKI USA FESTIVAL - General Rules

- This event is open to all dogs and handlers irrespective of their level in UKI and their organization affiliation.
- There is no pre-qualification necessary to enter classes.
- There is a separate competition for each jump height except for the Team event.
- Dogs and handlers need to be UKI members. Memberships can be completed online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
- Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event.
- A dog may only be handled by one handler throughout the event.
- All Q's must be in the height that will be run at the Opens.
- Any Q's / Byes gained must be the same handler that will run the dog at the Opens.
- The same handler must compete in both rounds of a class.
- Classes will be run in strict running order. Running orders will be randomly drawn for all rounds of the Team event and the first round of each class of Agility Biathlon, Masters Series Heat, all consist of 2 rounds.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations with additional rules detailed below. Any further amendments will be posted and or announced in the event confirmation letter.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules. Any amendments to these rules will be posted.
- Eliminations in all classes except where noted differently in the individual class rules, will score 100 faults & a 60 sec. course time
- No shows & NFC in any class except where noted differently in the individual class rules, will score 1000 faults & a 60 sec course time.

The Festival Winner – Each jump height will produce the best scoring dog from the overall results for the Agility Biathlon and Masters Heat.

The Winner will be granted bye into Round 2 of the National Championship Class at the 2026 US Open plus an automatic Bye into the West Coast Open Agility Stakes Final. If the event is after the end of the 2026 qualifying period for the WCO (July 28, 2026) the bye can be used for the 2026 WCO event.

The Festival Winning Team - will receive an automatic Bye into the Team Final at the 2026 US Open in FLORIDA.

The Festival Winner Scoring

Both the Agility Biathlon and Masters Heat must be entered with dogs running all classes for competition, to be eligible for the Festival Winner result.

The tabulation for the Festival Winner will be based upon the number of dogs entered within each jump height in each event. The winner of the event (i.e. Agility Biathlon) will receive the highest points which is equal to the total number entered in that jump height. Example: If 12 dogs are entered in the 22 inch height in the Agility Biathlon then the winner will receive 12 points, 2nd place 11, 3rd place 10 and so on. All dogs entered will receive the points based upon their ranking, even if they are not eligible for the Overall awards

- Only one handler may compete with the dog throughout the entire event to be eligible for the Festival's Overall Winner tabulation.
- A no-show or NFC in either class will result in disqualification from that competition, including awards and entry into the Festival's Overall Winner result.
- Double Eliminations for each competition will not be placed in that event and will score 0 for the Festival's Overall Winner tabulation.
- If a dog obtains a double elimination in both events, they are no longer eligible for the Festival's Overall tabulation.
- In the event of a tie for the Festival Overall Winner, the Masters Series Heat placement will be the deciding factor and if necessary, followed by the Biathlon, then Masters Agility class and then the Biathlon Agility Class.
- Should a dog win the Festival's Overall Result but had previously obtained this result at another Festival, the result will not move down to the next placing dog.

UKI Progression points

Clear rounds in Masters Agility, Biathlon Agility and Team Agility will count towards level progression for Agility points.

Clear rounds in Masters Jumping, Biathlon Jumping and Team Jumping will count towards level progression for Jumping points.

All clear rounds will count towards the Round Bye qualifications for the Nationals RD 2 bye at the US Open or Canadian Open or the West Coast Open for the UKI Agility Stakes Final.

UKI USA FESTIVAL CLASSES

Agility Biathlon

- Consists of a Jumping round and an Agility round with the results combined.
- Either round can be run first. Running order for second round will be in reverse order of first round results.
- Cumulative scoring; least faults wins with time as tiebreaker only, in all aspects of the Biathlon.
- In the event of a tie for the Agility Biathlon Winner, the scores from the Agility round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the last Biathlon course.
- Eliminations in first round will still progress to second round, with E's running random in the beginning of the RO for the second round.

Team Challenge - ONLY THE TEAM CAPTAIN WILL ENTER AND PAY FOR THE ENTIRE TEAM

- Teams consist of any 3 dogs and any 3 handlers from any jump heights (select and regular). A handler cannot have 2 dogs on the same team. A dog can only be on one team.
- Classes consist of an agility, jumping and team speedstakes relay all designed at the Senior level.
- Dogs must jump in the same height for all 3 team classes and must jump at the height they will run at the US Open if they qualify for the Team Final bye at the Festival. If they choose to change height at the US Open, the bye will be forfeited. (Those trying out for WAO should be mindful of what height they should be running at)
- Handlers with multiple dogs may compete in multiple teams provided that one dog is only on one team.
- Each Team must be entered with a Team Name no longer than 35 characters including spaces.
- Least faults win with time as tiebreaker only, in all aspects of the Team event
- The six individual results from each dog/handler partnership in the Team Agility class and the Team jumping will be combined with the result from the Team Relay
- Running Orders for the first 2 classes will be random within each jump height.
- The Team relay is a 3 dog Speedstakes relay. Dogs will run small to tall in the relay. If dogs are jumping the same jump height in a team, the handlers may choose the order of the dogs.
- Running Orders for the relay will be random and based on height combinations.
- A baton exchange between handlers will take place behind the start and finish jumps.
- The exchange must happen with both handlers and their dogs completely behind the line. Failure to do so will result in 10 faults for a faulted baton exchange. The handler waiting in the exchange area may hold or restrain their dog providing it is not deemed abusive or harsh by the judge in which case that dog will be eliminated. If holding the dog, the dog must be placed on the ground within the baton exchange area before the handler leaves this area to run. The handler waiting in the exchange area to run may have their dog on a lead. However, the lead must be removed before the baton exchange occurs or the dog will be eliminated.
- 10 faults will be assessed if the baton is dropped or thrown, whether inside the baton exchange area or outside of it. The handler must pick up the baton before they continue on course. Failure to pick up the baton will result in the dog being eliminated. In addition, if the dog takes an obstacle before the handler has picked up the baton, the dog will be eliminated.
- Once a dog and handler have finished and passed the baton, they must remain in the ring or be assessed a 100 point fault. They may also restrain or leash their dogs after the baton exchange.
- If the handler leaves the exchange area without the baton, their dog will be eliminated if it takes an obstacle on the course before the handler retrieves the baton.
- If a dog is eliminated, it will be given the maximum score of 50 faults. The clock is still running, so no time penalty is needed. The handler must make a sportsman-like attempt to finish the rest of the course correctly. If the judge deems that an eliminated handler is attempting to gain a time advantage by returning to the exchange area without correctly completing the course, the judge will add 50 seconds to the team's time.
- Dogs entered in the team must run in the 2 individual classes. A no-show or NFC in either Team class by a dog will result in disqualification from the Team competition, including awards.
- You may not substitute dogs into the team once the entry has closed for the Festival and refunds are not available if any team mates are unable to run any of the classes.
- Teams that qualify for the final at the US Open may use one substitute of any height (replacement partnership) if a dog or handler is unable to attend the US Open 2026. This substitute can only be used if the dog and/or handler are not entered at the US Open 2026.

Team final substitutes must be nominated to the UKI office before the closing date of the US Open 2026. Once the closing date of the US Open occurs, no further changes will be accepted for any reason.

Managing Conflicts for Handlers with Multiple Dogs

In the initial classes of each event a random draw will produce the running order. Handlers with more than one dog will have their running orders altered to achieve the following:

- A gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs) will be created by moving the first-drawn dog earlier in the running order. If this does not achieve a 10-dog gap then the second-drawn dog will be moved down in the running order.
- If there are not enough dogs in the class to achieve the 10-dog gap the biggest gap possible will be created. If this gap does not achieve the minimum 10 dog gap, then a break of 6 minutes will be given. The 6-minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete.
- Handlers with more than 2 dogs will have their dogs split using the 10-dog gap rule. If there are not enough dogs to achieve this, the dogs will be split evenly through the running order and the 6-minute rule will be adhered to. If a handler has dogs in different height divisions, and the 10 dog gap cannot be achieved, the 6 minutes will run through while the jump heights are being changed.

In seeded classes: A handler must notify the results office within 30 minutes of the results being posted of the previous class in that particular event if they wish to move their running order for the next round or given the 6 minute break. Failure to do so will mean they will be moved.



Masters Series Tournament Rules

The aim of the Masters Series is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level.

General Rules

Open to all UKI level dogs including Select heights. Separate competition for each height. Agility and Jumping rounds with results combined. Handlers must run in strict running orders, failure to do so will result in elimination. Either Agility or Jumping classes may run first. If a handler has 2 dogs entered within a jump height, they may move their first dog up so that there are as many dogs as possible between their dogs. If this is not possible, they will receive a 6-minute break. If a handler has more than 2 dogs within a jump height and the entry is not large enough for a sufficient gap in between all their dogs, the first of their dogs drawn will be allowed to run in between a jump height change, if a jump height change is available before their height. If it is not, the final decision will be made by the judge and show manager, taking into consideration fairness to the competitor and other entrants in the Masters Class. Day of Entries must run first within the running orders of the first class. The second class must run in reverse order of placing from first class. The dog must run in the height that he will compete at in the Masters Final. The same dog and handler must run both rounds. Only the handler who qualifies the dog through a Masters Heat, may run the dog in the Masters Final. Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UKI.

Scoring

Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. Time faults treated the same as course faults. An elimination = 100 faults plus 60 second course time. An absent or NFC run = 1000 faults with a 60 second course time. Dogs with an absent or NFC run in either the Agility or Jumping will forfeit any Q's or awards gained in the other round; in other words, both rounds must be run for competition. Dogs with double elimination will not be placed. An E in the individual round will not be placed in that round. Dogs with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie, the Agility result will be the deciding factor, followed by the jumping result. If a tie still remains, a runoff will be required. If there is a tie for the Individual class wins, a runoff will be required on that course to determine the winner and subsequent placings.

Final Qualification 2 ways to qualify for the Final to be held at the UKI US Open:

A. Individual Winners (per height) of the Masters Agility or Masters Jumping class (even if an E is earned in the other round).	B. 1st & 2nd Overall (per height) (even if an E is earned in one of the rounds).

Prizes

Of the Prize entry fee; \$5.00 is placed in heat prize fund. Each height has its own prize fund and will be divided as per Masters "Prize Money Guide". Prize fund is for overall winners only. \$1 from each entry fee will be evenly split & placed in the Final prize fund and Team USA WAO fund. In the event there is not a monetary winner within a height, the prize money will be sent to UKI to go towards the Final prize fund.

BY ENTERING UKI EVENTS, COMPETITORS AGREE TO the following and the terms and conditions on the entry forms

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of UK Agility International rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry

Please ensure to read the move up rules – section 2.0. At a UKI trial where the dog is competing for more than one day and the dog completes the requirements for a level on a prior day, they must move up the following day.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free from the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk; and neither the show or event management nor UKI will accept responsibility for any loss, damage or injury however caused or claimed to have been caused by or to dogs, persons or property while at the UKI event.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or its welfare is in danger if it continues competing. It is expressly understood that competitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, will at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. Any competitor or competitor's dog that is dismissed from the show by the judge and or show manager in accordance with UKI rules and regulations will have no recourse of any kind including, but not limited, to any refund of fees paid such as entry fees, camping fees, crating fees and any other fees associated with the event.

Rules of Conduct

UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions including on social media platforms.

By virtue of your entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that are imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring. The show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in a verbal warning, written warning and/or expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI officials, after further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or trial officials will take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds; actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog; wilful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show; any acts of poor sportsmanship; violation of procedural rules; compulsive, correctional training on the grounds; wilful misrepresentation on entry forms; wilful misrepresentation of animals; dog aggression; failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog including a dog clearly not under the control of the handler; concerns for the welfare of a dog or who is unfit for competing; intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors; creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct

Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, trial management & staff, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may warrant removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Refund and Entry Cancellation Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the date of account creation. A full refund is available before the closing date or capping level is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. After the closing date, a partial entry may be available for extraordinary circumstances, but this lies with the individual show management based on their own policies. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.

Payment of Entry fees

Payment of online entry fees and Instant Account Top up Fees (administration fee for online account payments) must be made directly to the UKI member account or directly to the trial before a competitor may compete. PLEASE BE AWARE – at the closing date of entries, if you are paying by check, your account balance under “My Account” will show as \$0.00 USD. A note will confirm that you are paying the trial directly. This enables you to enter and pay for other trials online. If you have a \$0.00 USD zero balance display on your UKI Home page, it does not constitute a cancelled entry. Only you are responsible to cancel your entry online by going back into the show you entered and clicking CANCEL MY ENTIRE ENTRY. UKI will not cancel any entries. If in doubt, you must check your entries from the My Entries link as well as reviewing your account transactions. If you have not cancelled your entry as above before the closing date, you are still responsible to pay the entry fee.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to a member's account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions, not limited to, are submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts and late payment fees.

Media & Sponsor Rights Release

Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right. Sponsors of UKI events may email entrants with their product and or service information. If a competitor does not wish to receive emails from these sponsors, they must email the show management before the close of the trial entry date to declare this, ensuring they receive a receipt email that this information has been received by the trial management.
