The show site is indoors on artificial turf. Crating is available in the room adjoining the arena. Please put a tarp or mat under your crate. Crates may be left overnight; but, MAC and OTR will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

Trial Site Rules: Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. **NO SPIKE SHOES OR HEELS on the turf.** Please wear/use clean, athletic footwear to preserve the flooring! More info at [On the Run's Gym Rules](#).

All dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the ring or the designated warm-up area. Exercise and toilet your dog in designated areas. Please poop and scoop and use the outdoor garbage containers. Be courteous to others. No aggressive dogs.

Equipment: Plastic jumps, ascending spread jump, broad jump, saloon-style tire, and rubberized contacts will be used. A warm-up jump will be provided for all exhibitors.

Food: MAC will provide lunch, beverages, and snacks for all workers. There is fast food within a 10-minute drive.

Bitches in Season (BIS): May run at this show. To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary. The BIS will remain in their running order and BIS will be designated next to the name on the running orders. The BIS must wear pants while inside the building including when running. The handler/owner acknowledges the inherent risk of running a dog on an agility course with BIS pants on and assumes all risk by doing so.

NFC Reward Box will NOT be allowed at this trial: NFC runs (with toy rewards) are allowed but will be limited to a maximum of 50 seconds (or total game time, whichever is less).

Change of Handler: You must notify the show manager of any changes of handler as soon as possible and no later than the morning of the trial.

Your entry is not valid until payment is received. MyDogEntry (MDE) entries paid by credit card or Zelle are confirmed immediately; MDE "paper entries" or mailed entries are confirmed when we receive your check. (You can submit MDE paper entries & mail the PDF and your check in advance so that your entry can be confirmed on the opening date.)

Waitlist order is based on when you submit your MDE entry, regardless of payment method. For MDE "paper entries," we must receive your check within 7 days to hold your waitlist position. Otherwise, your position is based on when the check is received.

Note - MAC has chosen to offer SS Challenge, which is not an official Classic event. Its entries may be capped so that more teams can enter Pentathlon & Masters Jumping on Friday.

UKI US Classic - General rules

- This event is open to all dogs and handlers irrespective of their level in UKI and their organization affiliation.
- There is no pre-qualification necessary to enter classes.
- There is a separate competition for each jump height.
- Dogs and handlers need to be UKI members. Register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
- A dog may only be handled by one handler throughout the event.
- Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event.
- Handlers who are collecting points for US Open or WCO Byes must be the same dog and handler partnership that compete in these events and at the Open and must run in the height that the Q's and Byes were gained at.
- Classes will be run in strict running order unless otherwise specified. Running orders will be randomly drawn for the first round of each class of Biathlon, Pentathlon and Masters Series Heat.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations with additional rules detailed below. Any further amendments will be posted and or announced.
- MAC allows Beginner/Novice dogs to enter individual runs of the Classic Pentathlon on Saturday & Sunday. Those competitors will run in a group at the beginning of the class. They can compete for a qualifying leg and, if clear, earn 4 level points regardless of how the result compares to the others in the class. They also are not counted in the tournament tallies or given any results placement. If they receive a clean run, the dog's result will be recorded as the course time so as no comparison and placement will be made with those entered in the tournament.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules. Any amendments to these rules will be announced to competitors either in the confirmation information or general briefings.

UKI Classic Pentathlon Winners – The winners of the Speedstakes Final from the Classic Pentathlon in each jump height will receive an automatic bye into the Speedstakes Challenge Final at the 2026 UKI US Open Florida and a bye into the Speedstakes Challenge Final at the 2026 West Coast Open, plus an automatic bye into the Masters Series Final at the 2026 UKI US Open Florida.

Classic Biathlon Winners - If the Winners of the Overall Placement of the Classic Biathlon in each jump height win without an E in either class, they will receive an automatic Bye into **Round 2 of the UKI National Championship Class at the 2026 UKI US Open Florida.**

Biathlon – Sponsored by Fusion Pet Retreat & Happy Dog Lodge

- Consists of a Jumping round and Agility round with the results combined.
- Either round can be run first. Running order for second round will be in reverse order of first round results.
- Cumulative scoring: Least faults wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Biathlon.
- In the event of a tie for the Agility Biathlon Winner, the scores from the Agility round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the result of jumping run will determine the winner, and if necessary, then the dogs will compete in a run-off on the last biathlon course.
- Eliminations in first round will still progress to second round, with E's running random in the beginning of the RO for the second round.
- Double eliminations will not be placed.

Pentathlon - Sponsored by Canine Sports Zone & 1-TDC

- Consists of 4 preliminary classes with points allocated for placements in each class that are combined into one result to enable participation to run in the Final.
- The 4 preliminary classes include Snooker, Gamblers, Agility, & Jumping, designed under the Senior level guidelines and run and scored under UKI Rules & Regulations.
- The Final consists of a Speedstakes course and is run and scored under normal UKI Rules & Regulations.
- The tabulation for each of the 4 preliminary classes is based upon the number of dogs entered within each jump height in each event. The winner of the class (i.e. Snooker) will receive the highest points which is equal to the total number entered in that jump height. Example: If 12 dogs are entered in the 22 inch height then the winner will receive 12 points, 2nd place 11, 3rd place 10 and so on.
- Eliminations (dogs not stopping the timers by going over the finish jump in Gamblers and Snooker) will score 0 points.
- Eliminations in Jumping or Agility will score 0 points.
- A no-show in any of the classes or if any of the classes are run for NFC - will result in a loss of eligibility to move onto the Final, regardless of ranking in the other classes.
- The top 50% from the 4 preliminary rounds will progress on to the Speedstakes Final.
- Dogs with 3 or more 0 scoring results in preliminary classes will not progress onto the Final.
- The bottom 50%, including those that scored three or more zeros, will move on to the Speedstakes Consolation Run that is scored under normal UKI Rules & Regulations. The running order for the Consolation class will be random draw.
- A tie at the 50% cutoff will round up to move all tied dogs into the Final.

- The running orders for the preliminary classes will be random order.
- The running orders for the Final will be reverse order of the combined result of the preliminary score after the 4 rounds. If there is a tie for running order placement, the Agility placement, followed by the Jumping placement, followed by the Gamblers placement will determine the running order.
- Placements in the Speedstakes Final (and the automatic byes) are only calculated from the results in the Final and do not include the cumulative results from the 4 preliminary classes.

Speedstakes Challenge – Sponsored by Agile Canines Training School & Animal Inn

- Consists of 2 Speedstakes rounds with the results combined.
- Running order for Round 2 will be in reverse order of Round 1 result.
- Cumulative scoring: Least faults wins with time as the tie breaker only.
- In the event of a tie for the Speedstakes Challenge, the scores from round 2 will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the round 2 course.
- Eliminations in Round 1 will still progress to Round 2 with E's running random in the beginning of the RO for the 2nd Round.

UKI Progression points

- Clear rounds in Masters Agility, Biathlon Agility, and Pentathlon Agility will count towards level progression for Agility points.
- Clear rounds in Masters Jumping, Biathlon Jumping, and Pentathlon Jumping will count towards level progression for Jumping points.
- Clear rounds in Pentathlon Snooker and Pentathlon Gamblers will count towards level progression for Games points.
- Clear rounds in the Speedstakes Challenge, Pentathlon Speedstakes Finals, and Pentathlon Consolation Speedstakes will count towards level progression for the Speedstakes Program.
- All clear rounds will count towards the Round Bye qualifications for the Nationals round 2 bye at the US Open, Canadian Open, or West Coast Open for the UKI Agility Stakes Final.

Awards

- Clear round and placement ribbons will be available for all individual clear rounds in Beg/Nov Agility on Sunday (the only regular titling class). Clear round ribbons will be available for Beg/Nov dogs entered a la carte in a Pentathlon class.
- There will be special awards and podium presentations for Speedstakes Challenge, Biathlon, Masters Series, and Pentathlon Finals, including a special award for the overall high-scoring Pentathlon dogs in each height based on all 5 Pentathlon classes that is separate from the Pentathlon Speedstakes Finals awards.

Managing conflicts for handlers with multiple dogs in non-seeded classes

In the initial classes of each event (non-seeded runs), a random draw will produce the running order. Handlers with more than one dog will have their running orders altered to achieve the following:

- A gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs) will be created by moving the first-drawn dog earlier in the running order. If this does not achieve a 10-dog gap then the second-drawn dog will be moved down in the running order.
- If there are not enough dogs in the class to achieve the 10-dog gap the biggest gap possible will be created. If this gap does not achieve the minimum 10 dog gap, then a break of 6 minutes will be given. The 6 minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete.
- Handlers with more than 2 dogs will have their dogs split using the 10-dog gap rule. If there are not enough dogs to achieve this, the dogs will be split evenly through the running order and the 6 minute rule will be adhered to. If a handler has dogs in different height divisions, and the 10 dog gap cannot be achieved, the 6 minutes will run through while the jump heights are being changed.

Multiple dog conflicts in seeded classes:

In the seeded classes, a handler has earned their running order and the advantage this brings; therefore, their dogs will not be automatically moved to create a gap. Instead, they will be given 6 minute break between dogs. However, a handler may choose to move their first dog to a spot earlier in the running order to create a gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs). If this is unable to be achieved, the 6 minute rule will be used. A handler must notify the results office within 30 minutes of the results being posted of the previous class in that particular event if they wish to move their running order for the next round. Failure to do so will mean they will be given a 6 minute break. By entering more than one dog in this event, handlers indicate their acceptance to comply with these rules.

Masters Series Tournament Rules

Sponsored by Chiropractic for Everybody (CFE)

The aim of Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both the National and International levels.

General rules:

Open to all UKI level dogs including Select heights. Separate competition for each height. Agility and Jumping rounds with results combined. Handlers must run in strict running orders; failure to do so will result in elimination. Either Agility or Jumping classes may run first. If a handler has 2 dogs entered within a jump height, they may move their first dog up so that there are as many dogs as possible between their dogs. If this is not possible, they will receive a 6-minute break. If a handler has more than 2 dogs within a jump height and the entry is not large enough for a sufficient gap in between all their dogs, the first of their dogs drawn will be allowed to run in between a jump height change, if a jump height change is available before their height. If it is not, the final decision will be made by the judge and show manager, taking into consideration fairness to the competitor and other entrants in the Masters class. Day-of entries must run first within the running orders of the first class. The second class must run in reverse order of placing from first class. The dog must run in the height that he will compete at in the Masters Final. The same dog and handler must run both rounds. Only the handler who qualifies the dog through a Masters Heat may run the dog in the US Open Masters Final. Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UKI.

Scoring:

Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. Time faults treated the same as course faults. An elimination = 100 faults plus 60 second course time. An absent or NFC run = 1000 faults with a 60 second course time. Dogs with an absent or NFC run in either the Agility or Jumping will forfeit any Q's or awards gained in the other round; in other words, both rounds must be run for competition. Dogs with double elimination will not be placed. An E in the individual round will not be placed in that round. Dogs with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie, the Agility result will be the deciding factor, followed by the jumping result. If a tie still remains, a runoff will be required. If there is a tie for the Individual class wins, a runoff will be required on that course to determine the winner and subsequent placings.

Final qualification:

2 ways to qualify for the Final to be held at the UKI US Open:

A. Individual Winners (per height) of the Masters Agility or Masters Jumping class (even if an E is earned in the other round).

B. 1st & 2nd Overall (per height) (even if an E is earned in one of the rounds).

Prizes:

Of the Prize entry fee, \$5.00 is placed in heat prize fund. Each height has its own prize fund and will be divided as per Masters "Prize Money Guide." Prize fund is for overall winners only. \$1 from each entry fee will be split & placed in the Final prize fund and Team USA WAO fund. In the event there is not a monetary winner within a height, the prize money will be sent to UKI to go towards the Final prize fund.

Measuring Dogs

Please ensure you understand the new criteria regarding dogs being measured ([UKI 11th Edition Rule Book.pdf](#)) A summary of the rules can also be found here [Jump Heights | UK Agility International](#)

If a dog is under 3 and newly registered, a temporary measure or proof of the dog's height must be done by the dog's 3rd trial. A permanent measure must be obtained by a UKI official measurer between 12-18 months after the dog's first/temporary measure. Any registered dog that only has a temporary measure must follow the above rule. If a newly registered dog is over 3, they must obtain a measure by an official UKI measurer by their 3rd trial and this measurement will be permanent.

Level Move-ups

Exhibitors are responsible for tracking their dog's points in each of the two UKI programs and must move their dog to the next eligible level on the following day of a multiple-day trial once sufficient points have been earned. Competitors must notify the trial secretary on the day their dog gains enough points to move up in a particular program. Exhibitors may log into their UKI account to confirm and tally points. Please consult the UKI rule book for detailed information on level requirements.

1. Assumption of Risk & Liability

By entering this event, the handler/owner certifies that any and all dogs brought to the event, whether participating or not, do not pose a hazard to persons, dogs, or property.

As the owner of any dog entered in this event, its duly authorized agent or handler of any dog (collectively, the "Handler"), and in consideration of participation in this event, the Handler agree(s) to adhere to UK Agility International rules and regulations and any additional rules and regulations that may be set forth herein (the "Rules"). By entering this event, Handler hereby agrees to indemnify and hold UK Agility International and UK Agility, Ltd., (collectively, "UKI"), their agents, officers, directors and employees, event hosts, trial secretary, judges and their assistants, harmless from and against any and all losses and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees and costs) that may be imposed upon it or them, resulting from Handler's participation in this event, including but not limited to any claims or demands for loss or injury alleged to have been caused to any equipment or any dog or person while in attendance at this event, and to accept full responsibility therefor.

2. Hazards & Safety

The exhibitor/owner acknowledges all potential hazards associated with the training facility, event, and premises, including but not limited to:

- The condition of the grounds
- Lighting and security measures (or lack thereof)
- Electrical appliances and fittings
- Parking areas, camping areas and fencing
- The potential for a dog to escape from the training or competition area
- The presence of unfamiliar animals and people
- The presence of other dogs
- The risk of exposure to illness
- Agility equipment
- Course design and course set up
- Weather conditions including any other 'Acts of God'

By entering, you voluntarily assume any and all risks associated with these hazards and any other potential hazards not listed. All participants must exercise caution, monitor their dogs, and clean up after themselves and their animals.

3. Conduct & Enforcement

UK Agility International reserves the right to:

- Excuse any participant for what it deems excessive harshness toward a dog and for behavior considered aggressive or abusive toward another person or dog.
- Revoke, suspend, or ban any entry or membership at its sole discretion if deemed necessary to protect the interests of UK Agility and any of its associates, agents, officers, or members.

Participation in UKI events, including membership, is a **privilege, not a right**. UK Agility International has full authority to impose suspensions or bans without prior notice.

4. Rules & Regulations

By entering, Handler agrees to comply with all UK Agility International Rules & Regulations, including any amendments. Additionally, Handler confirms that:

- Handler will not bring any dog that has been exposed to an infectious or contagious disease within 21 days prior to the event.
- To the best of Handler's knowledge, your dog is not subject to disqualification under UK Agility International show regulations.
- Handler accepts full responsibility for the safety of both Handler and Handler's dog(s).

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page. Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International rules and regulations** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry.

Please ensure to read the **move up rules – section 2.0**. At a UKI trial where the dog is competing for more than one day and the dog completes the requirements for a level on a prior day, they must move up the following day.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free from the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken the show management and UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property while at the UKI event.

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UKI Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Speedstakes classes.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or its welfare is in danger if it continues competing. It is expressly understood that competitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, will at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. Any competitor or competitor's dog that is dismissed from the show by the judge and or show manager in accordance with UKI rules and regulations will have no recourse of any kind including, but not limited, to any refund of fees paid such as entry fees, camping fees, crating fees and any other fees associated with the event.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

Rules of Conduct:

UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions including on social media platforms.

By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that are imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring. The show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in a verbal warning, written warning and/or expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI head officials, through further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or trial officials will take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds; actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog; willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show; any acts of poor sportsmanship; violation of procedural rules; compulsive, correctional training on the grounds; willful misrepresentation on entry forms; willful misrepresentation of animals; dog aggression; failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog including a dog clearly not under the control of the handler; concerns for the welfare of a dog or who is unfit for competing; intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors; creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct

Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, trial management & staff, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may sanction removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Refund and Entry Cancellation Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund of your Classic entry is available if you notify the show manager before the closing date for this trial. (MAC will shred or return your entry check). A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the date of account creation. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. **After the closing date, a partial entry refund, paid in MAC vouchers, may be available for injuries where a veterinarian note is provided. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.**

Payment of entry fees shall be made directly to MAC before a competitor may compete. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls to a UK Agility International account must be paid within 14 days. UK Agility International will suspend a dog's/handlers' registration, until fees are paid in full. Failure to do this will result in your UKI account being suspended.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to a member's account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions, not limited to, are submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts and late payment fees. Charges are based on an hourly rate of \$20 per hour.
