UKI DASH - General Rules

- Dogs and handlers need to be UKI members. Register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
- Entry is open to everyone irrespective of the dog's UKI level.
- Dogs and handlers must be registered with UKI.
- Each class has a separate competition for each jump height.
- Dogs may only compete at one height throughout the whole event.
- Dogs may only compete with one handler in DASH Tournament Classes. If this rule is broken handlers and dogs will be disqualified from the whole DASH event.
- Classes will be run in strict running order. Running orders will be randomly drawn for all rounds except the Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final.
- Failure to be on the start line for your turn will result in Elimination and unable to run in the class.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations, with additional rules detailed in the premium. Any further amendments will be posted on the trial's social media page for the event.
- In the event of a tie for a progression place in the Triathlon, the result from the FUSION Agility will decide the winner followed by the result from the Jumping.
- In the event of a tie for a progression place into a final, both dogs will go through to the Final.
- In the event of a tie for a top 3 overall podium in a Final, a runoff will be required. If a competitor chooses not to run in a runoff, they forfeit their place, and the higher place will go to the other competitor. A coin toss will determine the placings if both competitors do not want to run in a runoff.
- In the event of a tie to determine the running order in the Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final, a coin toss will determine the running order.
- A no-show in any class or any round of an event will result in disqualification from that event, including prizes and awards and will incur 1000 faults.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules and in any exceptional circumstances.
- The Steeplechase DASH Challenge and Final will use a scoring of 5 faults = 5 seconds. The FUSION DASH Triathlon will use the least faults wins with time as a tiebreaker.
- FUSION DASH Pentathlon Agility classes must have 3 contact passes per course, the Dogwalk may not be used.
- Courses may have up to 22 obstacles at this event.
- The minimum and maximum distances (dogs' path according to the course design program) will be 20-28 feet with an average maximum distance of 25 feet.
- Show Management is committed to safety and is determined to provide premier equipment, running surface and course design. However, unforeseen circumstances may arise that are out of our control. By entering this event, you accept that you have a personal choice not to run in any class if, for any reason, you believe there are safety issues due to differing opinions on course design and/or environmental factors. You agree by entering this event that you have no comeback or right for a refund on any course you do not wish to run due to course design and/or environmental factors.

The DASH Tourney Overall Winner

Each jump height will produce the best scoring dog based on the overall results of those who ran in the Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final and the results of the DASH Triathlon. The winner will gain a bye into the Speedstakes Final at both the USO & WCO & will also gain a Rd 2 Nationals Bye at the USO & CO. If the overall winner has not already achieved a bye for one of the Finals at the DASH Open, they may choose one of the Finals as their automatic Bye.

The tabulation for the Overall winner will be based on the number of dogs entered within each jump height in both events. The event winner (i.e. Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final) will receive the highest points equal to the total number entered in that jump height. Example: If 10 dogs are entered in the 24-inch height in the Steeplechase Challenge, then the winner will receive 10 points, 2nd place 9, 3rd place 8 and so on. All dogs entered will receive the points based upon their ranking, even if they are not eligible for the Overall awards. Eliminations in the Steeplechase Challenge Final will receive 0 points.

- Only dogs progressing into the Final of the Steeplechase DASH Challenge are eligible for the Overall tabulation.
- A no-show or NFC in any class will result in disqualification from any awards or progression for that event and overall winner result.
- If a dog is eliminated in the Final, they are no longer eligible for the overall award.

- If a dog obtains TWO eliminations in the Triathlon event, they are no longer eligible for the Overall award.
- In the event of a tie for the overall winner, the Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final placement will be the deciding factor.

Should a dog win the overall result and has previously obtained this result at another DASH Tourney, the result will not move down to the next placed dog.

1. Steeplechase DASH Challenge & Final

Scoring: Faults converted to time. 1:1. i.e. 5 faults equals 5 seconds

Eliminations will score 50 faults with 50 second course time.

Three preliminary rounds and a Final

- Rd 1 - Speedstakes (jumps & tunnels). Clear rounds will earn *4 level points in Speedstakes*
- Rd 2 – Speedstakes Jumping (Jumps, tunnels 1 x weave). Clear rounds will earn *4 level points in Jumping*
- Rd 3 - Steeplechase (jumps, tunnels, 1 x AF, 1 x weave). *No progression points awarded.*

The top 10 or top 25% (whichever is higher) from the combined rounds 1-3 will progress into the Final.
(Any No Show or NFC rounds in the above classes do not progress.)

- Final - Speedstakes class. *No progression points awarded.*

SDC Final Winner Award – Gains a Bye into Steeplechase DASH Challenge Final at The UKI DASH Open.

2. DASH Triathlon

Scoring: Least faults wins with time as a tiebreaker.

Eliminations will score 100 faults with 50 second course time.

Three Rounds with results combined to determine the winner

- Rd 1 FUSION Agility (3 contact passes). Clear rounds will earn *4 level points in Agility*
- Rd 2 Jumping. Clear rounds will earn *4 level points in Jumping*
- Rd 3 Speedstakes. Clear rounds will earn *4 level points in Speedstakes*

(Any No Show or NFC rounds in the above classes will not be placed.)

DASH Triathlon Winner Award - Gains a Bye into FUSION DASH Pentathlon Final at The UKI DASH Open

Managing Conflicts for Handlers with Multiple Dogs in Non-Seeded Classes

In the initial classes of each event (non-seeded runs) a random draw will produce the running order. Handlers with more than one dog will have their running orders altered to achieve the following:

- A gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs) will be created by moving the first-drawn dog earlier in the running order. If this does not achieve a 10-dog gap then the second-drawn dog will be moved down in the running order.
- If there are not enough dogs in the class to achieve the 10-dog gap the biggest gap possible will be created. If this gap does not achieve the minimum 10 dog gap, then a break of 6 minutes will be given. The 6 minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete.
- Handlers with more than 2 dogs will have their dogs split using the 10-dog gap rule. If there are not enough dogs to achieve this, the dogs will be split evenly through the running order and the 6 minute rule will be adhered to. If a handler has dogs in different height divisions, and the 10 dog gap cannot be achieved, the 6 minutes will run through while the jump heights are being changed.

Multiple dog conflicts in Seeded classes:

In the seeded classes a handler has earned their running order and the advantage this brings; therefore, their dogs will not be automatically moved to create a gap. Instead, they will be given 6 minute break between dogs. However, a handler may choose to move their first dog to a spot earlier in the running order to create a gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs). If this is unable to be achieved, the 6 minute rule will be used. A handler must notify the results office within 30 minutes of the results being posted of the previous class in that particular event if they wish to move their running order for the next round. Failure to do so will mean they will be given a 6 minute break. By entering more than one dog in this event, handlers indicate their acceptance to comply with these rules.

The Terms and conditions referred to in the box from the entry form page (4)

You must read and agree to these conditions and provisions before submitting your entry.

By entering this event, you, as the entrant, acknowledge that you are authorized to act on behalf of both yourself and any other UK Agility International (UKI) members who will participate under your entry.

Assumption of Risk & Liability

By entering this event, the handler/owner certifies that any and all dogs brought to the event, whether participating or not, do not pose a hazard to persons, dogs, or property.

As the owner of any dog entered in this event, its duly authorized agent or handler of any dog (collectively, the "Handler"), and in consideration of participation in this event, the Handler agree(s) to adhere to UK Agility International rules and regulations and any additional rules and regulations that may be set forth herein (the "Rules"). By entering this event, Handler hereby agrees to indemnify and hold UK Agility International and UK Agility, Ltd., (collectively, "UKI"), their agents, officers, directors and employees, event hosts, trial secretary, judges and their assistants, harmless from and against any and all losses and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees and costs) that may be imposed upon it or them, resulting from Handler's participation in this event, including but not limited to any claims or demands for loss or injury alleged to have been caused to any equipment or any dog or person while in attendance at this event, and to accept full responsibility therefor.

2. Hazards & Safety

Handler acknowledges all potential hazards associated with the training facility, event, and premises, including but not limited to:

- The condition of the grounds
- Lighting and security measures (or lack thereof)
- Electrical appliances and fittings
- Parking areas, camping areas and fencing
- The potential for a dog to escape from the training or competition area
- The presence of unfamiliar animals and people
- The presence of other dogs
- The risk of exposure to illness
- Agility equipment
- Course design and course set up
- Weather conditions including any other 'Acts of God'

By entering, Handler voluntarily assumes any and all risks associated with these hazards and any other potential hazards not listed. All participants must exercise caution, monitor their dogs, and clean up after themselves and their animals.

3. Conduct & Enforcement

UK Agility International reserves the right to:

- Excuse any participant for what it deems excessive harshness toward a dog and for behavior considered aggressive or abusive toward another person or dog.
- Revoke, suspend, or ban any entry or membership in its sole discretion if deemed necessary to protect the interests of UKI and any of its associates, agents, officers, or members.

Participation in UKI events, including membership, is a PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT. UK Agility International has full authority to impose suspensions or bans upon any member without prior notice.

4. Rules & Regulations

By entering, Handler agrees to comply with all UK Agility International Rules & Regulations, including any amendments. Additionally, Handler confirms that:

- Handler will not bring any dog that has been exposed to an infectious or contagious disease within 21 days prior to the event.
- To the best of Handler's knowledge, your dog is not subject to disqualification under UK Agility International show regulations.
- Handler accepts full responsibility for the safety of both Handler and Handler's dog(s).

Measuring Dogs

Please ensure you understand the criteria regarding dogs being measured. Refer to the current edition rule book which can be found on the UKI web page. [UKI 11th Edition Rule Book.pdf](#) A summary of the rules can also be found here [Jump Heights | UK Agility International](#)

If a dog is under 3 and newly registered, a temporary measure or proof of the dog's height must be done by the dog's 3rd trial. A permanent measure must be obtained by a UKI official measurer between 12-18 months after the dog's first/temporary measure. Any registered dog that only has a temporary measure, must follow the above rule. If a newly registered dog is over 3, they must obtain a measure by an official UKI measurer by their 3rd trial and this measurement will be permanent.

Level Move-ups

Exhibitors are responsible for tracking their dog's points in each of the two UKI programs and must move their dog to the next eligible level on the following day of a multiple-day trial once sufficient points have been earned. Competitors must notify the trial secretary on the day their dog gains enough points to move up in a particular program. Exhibitors may log into their UKI account to confirm and tally points. Please consult the UKI rule book for detailed information on level requirements.

BY ENTERING UKI EVENTS, COMPETITORS AGREE TO the following and the terms and conditions on the entry forms

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of UK Agility International rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry

Please ensure to read the move up rules – section 2.0. At a UKI trial where the dog is competing for more than one day and the dog completes the requirements for a level on a prior day, they must move up the following day.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free from the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk; and neither the show or event management nor UKI will accept responsibility for any loss, damage or injury however caused or claimed to have been caused by or to dogs, persons or property while at the UKI event.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or its welfare is in danger if it continues competing. It is expressly understood that competitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, will at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. Any competitor or competitor's dog that is dismissed from the show by the judge and or show manager in accordance with UKI rules and regulations will have no recourse of any kind including, but not limited, to any refund of fees paid such as entry fees, camping fees, crating fees and any other fees associated with the event.

Rules of Conduct

UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions including on social media platforms.

By virtue of your entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that are imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring. The show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in a verbal warning, written warning and/or expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI officials, after further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or trial officials will take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds; actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog; wilful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show; any acts of poor sportsmanship; violation of procedural rules; compulsive, correctional training on the grounds; wilful misrepresentation on entry forms; wilful misrepresentation of animals; dog aggression; failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog including a dog clearly not under the control of the handler; concerns for the welfare of a dog or who is unfit for competing; intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors; creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct

Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, trial management & staff, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may warrant removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Refund and Entry Cancellation Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the date of account creation. A full refund is available before the closing date or capping level is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. After the closing date, a partial entry may be available for extraordinary circumstances, but this lies with the individual show management based on their own policies. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.

Payment of Entry fees

Payment of online entry fees and Instant Account Top up Fees (administration fee for online account payments) must be made directly to the UKI member account or directly to the trial before a competitor may compete. PLEASE BE AWARE – at the closing date of entries, if you are paying by check, your account balance under “My Account” will show as \$0.00 USD. A note will confirm that you are paying the trial directly. This enables you to enter and pay for other trials online. If you have a \$0.00 USD zero balance display on your UKI Home page, it does not constitute a cancelled entry. Only you are responsible to cancel your entry online by going back into the show you entered and clicking CANCEL MY ENTIRE ENTRY. UKI will not cancel any entries. If in doubt, you must check your entries from the My Entries link as well as reviewing your account transactions. If you have not cancelled your entry as above before the closing date, you are still responsible to pay the entry fee.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to a member’s account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions, not limited to, are submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts and late payment fees.

Media & Sponsor Rights Release

Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog’s name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right. Sponsors of UKI events may email entrants with their product and or service information. If a competitor does not wish to receive emails from these sponsors, they must email the show management before the close of the trial entry date to declare this, ensuring they receive a receipt email that this information has been received by the trial management.
