ENTRY INFORMATION

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official AKC entry form for this event.

- No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.
- Owners are responsible for all errors on entry forms. No entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Type or print carefully to prevent error.
- Payment must be made in U.S. Funds.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF ENTRY

Acknowledgment of entry acceptance will be emailed upon processing to those listing a legible e-mail address on their entry form.

REFUNDS

- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.
- Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in Agility Trials. As such, the club will refund entry fees paid less a \$5 processing fee per day for bitches unable to compete for this reason upon presentation of a veterinarian certificate. This certificate must be presented to the Trial Secretary prior to the start of judging on the first day of the trial.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are prohibited from the trial grounds.

WAITLIST

Per Chapter 1, Section 16 Item 1 of the "Regulations for Agility Trials", entries received prior to the Closing Date but in excess of the trial entry limits shall be placed on a Wait List. The Wait List shall be limited to 50 entries each day.

The Wait List will close at 5pm one week before the first day of the trial series. While the Wait List is open it shall be used to fill withdrawn entries. A full refund of BOTC entry fees will be reimbursed to any entrant whose withdrawn entry can be replaced by a wait-listed entry.

MOVE UPS

Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the owner as a result of qualifying for an agility title. The request should be made in e-mail to the Trial Secretary, no later than 6 pm on the Monday preceding the first day of the trials. If you have any questions about this process, please contact the Trial Secretary.

Move-ups due to titles earned during this multi-day event will be allowed provided a written Move-Up request form is submitted to the Trial Secretary in person by 6:00 PM the previous day.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS & WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. The time and length of the walk-through will be the Judge's discretion.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training of the dog.

For Exhibition Only & Fix N Go On

For Exhibition Only (FEO) allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is allowed in all classes at this trial. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying. FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show. Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.

Fix and Go On (FNG) is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course. Please check with the Judge during the briefing for specific details.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

- Regular - Handlers may opt to run their dog in a higher height division.
- Preferred - Handlers must run their dog in their proper eligible height.
- Owners are responsible for entering their dog in the proper height division.

MEASURING AND HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

AKC no longer requires height cards to be submitted to Trial Secretaries during entry/check-in. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete, but the exhibitor shall meet requirements outlined below.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to:

- Understand if they have met the AKC height verification requirements for their dog.
- Indicate on entry form whether or not a measurement is required for the dog so the Trial Secretary can include their name on the "Dogs To Be Measured" list.
- Have their dog measured prior to running in the dog's first class; failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.
 - If no Volunteer Measuring Officials (VMO) nor AKC Agility Field Reps are attending the series of trials this will be done by the Judge of Record. This requirement is waived for dogs entered in the 24" height division.
 - If a VMO or AKC Agility Field Rep (Rep) is present, all dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured by them at some point during the series of trials. If the VMO/Rep is not available prior to the dog's first class, the Judge of Record will perform an initial measurement.

At least one VMO will be present onsite each day for dogs needing measuring. Check with the Trial Chair for the identity of the VMO(s) present each day.

OBSTACLES & RING CONDITION

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. Electronic timing will be used. The equipment for this event is being provided by MAX 200 and will be available for sale at the end of the event. If you are interested in a specific item, it is requested that you reserve it ahead of time. For more information, you may call MAX 200 at 800-446-2920 or e-mail them at sales@max200.com.

RIBBONS, AWARDS & PRIZES

- Each Qualifying Score will receive a Dark Green ribbon.
- Rosettes will be awarded for First - Fourth placement in each class & jump height division.
- "New Title" Rosettes will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.
- A MACH Rosette and decorated MACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH.
- A PACH Rosette and decorated PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their PACH.

B MATCH & SPECIAL COMPETITIONS

B MATCH

BOTC will be holding an Agility "B" Match after the end of Thursday's trial. A great event for your new/young dog. Low stress, fun and in the same ring as the weekend's trial. Entries will be accepted at the trial on Thursday. Advance entries are not required. See the flyer on BOTC's website (www.BOTCvt.org)

SPECIAL COMPETITIONS

BOTC will also be sponsoring additional "special" competitions during the course of the trial series. These will be fun competitions that will be based on results of the different trial classes and combinations of those classes.

- There will be no additional costs to enter the special competitions.
- Competition registrations will be accepted until the start of the walk-thru for the first class of each event. Some events are multi-class events so you will need to have entered each event to participate.
- Sign-up lists as well as BOTC's rules for these special events will be available at the Trial.

TEAM COMPETITION

All for fun! For Saturday, find 3 dogs and at least 2 different handlers running in any level of Jumpers with Weaves and create a team! Scores for the 3 dogs will be compiled to create the Team score. Prizes will be awarded for 1st thru 4th places as well as a special Vermont Maple "SAP" award for the lowest score.

GAMES CHAMPIONSHIP

This event will be for individual dog/handler teams and will combine the results of Friday's Time 2 Beat class with Saturday's FAST class. A single championship will be awarded to the dog/handler team with the highest combined score. In the case of a tie, the Champion will be the dog/handler team with the fastest combined time for the two classes.

DIRECTIONS TO THE TRIAL SITE

Directions to Shelburne Field House:

From Canada, NH, MA, CT, ME and RI: Take Interstate I-89 to Interstate I-189 (exit 13). Follow I-189 approximately 2 miles to its termination. Turn left onto US Route 7 south (Shelburne Road) and follow south approximately 5 miles to the Village of Shelburne. At the traffic light in the center of the Village, turn right onto Harbor Road. After crossing the railroad tracks, turn right at the second street onto Athletic Drive.

The Field House is approximately 6.5 miles from Exit 13, I-89.

From New York State: Travel north on US Route 7 to Shelburne. Turn left on Harbor Road. After crossing the railroad tracks, turn right at the second street onto Athletic Drive.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such a case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. BOTC and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the BOTC or any official thereof.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. The State of Vermont requires a rabies vaccination every three years.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when crated, using the designated warm-up jump or competing in the ring.

CRATING

Indoor Crating space will be available. All crates within the building must be located within the designated crating area. Please respect the lines denoting the crating area and keep exits open. The trial site requires a tarp to be placed on the floor underneath your crates. Crates may be left overnight; however, BOTC and The Field House will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class by the judge of record or a VMO or AKC Field Rep if one is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system, stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

SITE ETIQUETTE

It is important that we respect the trial site to allow for our continued use of the location. To that end, exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Please observe the following Shelburne Field House rules:

- No hard cleats will be allowed. Indoor soccer shoes and other footwear intended for artificial turf will be allowed.
- No food/eating on the artificial turf. Eating is allowed in the ground level hospitality area & upstairs mezzanine.
- No alcohol may be brought into the building.
- The building also houses a health club and rehab facility. Please respect parking spaces that are designated for the patrons of these facilities/businesses.
- No dogs on the playing surface of the exterior athletic fields.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

VENDORS

- There will be vendors at the trial.
- If you would like a vendor space, please contact the Trial Chair for more information.

PARKING

- The Site has parking in reasonable proximity to the building.
- Please respect the signage and marked spaces for other tenants of the building.

OUTDOOR WALKING AREAS FOR DOGS

- There is ample outdoor space for walking dogs both on the Trial Site and on the public sidewalks leading away from the Trial Site.
- Dogs may be walked around the outside of the exterior athletic fields but NOT on their playing surface.

For each class worked, volunteers will receive 2 tickets for a worker raffle to be drawn at the end of each day. A Bonus ticket for volunteering for positions you haven't worked before!

RUN ORDER

The Run Order will be available on MyDogEntry.com for review in advance of the trial and gate sheets will be available on-site for review.

AGREEMENT
